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• soil aggregates as «bricks» for a stable soil matrix and pore structure

•enhanced and accelerated development of root systems due to symbiotic fungi

• a resilient soil matrix with micro- and macro-aggregates •enmesh small organic and inorganic soil particles • form and cement the particles to micro- and macro-aggregates



• able to align primary particles

• exert pressure on surrounding particles

• supply the hosts with water and nutrients

•net negative charge under neutral pH values

• clay minerals are bound to negatively charged surface of fungal hyphae
